God Does Not Recognize Mixed Seeds

"A bastard ⁽¹⁹⁾ shall not enter into the congregation of the Lord; even to his tenth generation shall he not enter into the congregation of the Lord. An Ammonite or Moabite shall not enter into the congregation of the Lord; even to their tenth generation shall they not enter into the congregation of the Lord for ever." ⁽²⁰⁾

Any person born from a mixed union, such as Ishmael was not recognized as a Hebrew, nor was he recognized by God as Abraham's lawful son, even though he <u>was</u> Abraham's first born. We read in Genesis: "...now I know that thou fearest God, seeing thou has not withheld thy son, **thine only son** from me." ⁽²¹⁾ Isaac was seventeen years old when this happened, and Ishmael, Abraham's first born was living and was about thirty-four years old at that time. ⁽²²⁾ This, clearly shows, that **God does not** and **did not recognize mixed seeds** [mixed breeds]. The reason Abraham was not put to death, when he made the union with the Egyptian woman, was because at that time in history the Egyptians were White people and not Negroes. We must remember, we the White Race are Israelites, if we are pure white. If one could not prove that they were an Israelite (pure white man/woman) they were cast out of the priesthood and not allowed to serve God at the altar. "And he that is the high priest among his brethren, upon whose head the anointing oil was poured, and that is consecrated to put on the garments... shall take a virgin of **his own people to wife.** Neither shall he profane his seed [mix his seed with other races] among his people..." ⁽²³⁾

Here again is the distinction of our seed. We see references to various mixtures. Remember that the White Race is **now** called Caucasians, but were known **before** by nationality and even earlier as Israelites. But when Israel sinned against God and He divorced her, they were not allowed to be called Israelites [meaning ruling with God], so their name of Israel was lost to them and they became known by other names; i.e., Germans, Englishmen, Frenchmen, Dutch, Americans, Canadians and etc.
